After completing document authentication at TECO, the process for returning to Taiwan and settling is as follows:

1. National Immigration Agency, R.O.C. (Taiwan)

Apply for Permanent residency in Taiwan

- The applicant's parents must personally sign the Residency Consent Form and the Children's Name Agreement.
- Submit documents authenticated at our office
- · Passport-sized photo.
- Permanent Resident Certificate application: Processing time is seven working days (excluding holidays).

Exchange of Permanent Resident Certificate

- A copy of the residence certificate must be stamped with an entry seal upon arrival. Only then can you exchange it for the original residence certificate at the Immigration Agency.
- Applicants aged 12 to 70 must personally exchange the copy for the original certificate after entering Taiwan.
- The certificate is valid for 6 months; you must enter Taiwan before it expires. If expired, a new application is required.
- Exchange of Permanent Resident Certificate Copies for Permanent Resident Certificate: Three (3) days. (excluding holidays).

2. Dept. of Household Registration, M.O.I.

Apply for marriage registration and children's citizenship.

- Register for citizenship within 30 days starting the day after receiving the Permanent Resident Certificate.
- Marriage Registration: Submit the English and Chinese versions of the marriage certificate, both parties' identification documents, and a signed Chinese Name Declaration by the foreign spouse.(authenticated by our office)
- Children's Citizenship: Provide the Permanent Resident Certificate, a passport-sized photo, and the passport or other identification documents authenticated by our office.
- Confirm in advance whether the head of household must personally handle the citizenship registration.
- · Processing time: One day

3. Bureau of Consular Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs., R.O.C. (Taiwan)



- Documents for identity verification after obtaining citizenship, such as household registration transcript and identity card.
- · The passport used by the applicant upon entry.
- Identification documents of both parents (or guardians) of the applicant.
- · Two passport-sized photos with a white background.
- · Processing time: Approximately two weeks.

Here are the important notes:

- If the applicant's parents return to Taiwan together, they can use the original birth certificate verified by our office along with a self-translated Chinese version. They should have this notarized by a notary public in Taiwan.
- For the Residence Consent Form / Chinese Translation Documents / Children's Name Agreement, the parents must sign in person at our office. If it is inconvenient to come to our office, bring the documents to a notary public for signature.
- For children born out of wedlock under the mother's residency: Provide the mother's national ID card and an affidavit
 of single status. It is advisable to also include a Certificate of Single Status (CONI) issued by the New Zealand Department of
 Internal Affairs.
- For residency based on the father: Proof of Completion of the Adoption Process by the Father.
- For divorced parents: Include a consent letter from the guardian of the child verified by our office.
- For children conceived before marriage: Provide proof of familial relationship and documents proving no marital relationship.
- For applicants of legal age applying for residency: Enter Taiwan with a Taiwan passport and additionally provide a New Zealand criminal record check authenticated by our office, and a health examination report (with a passport-sized photo).
