

Visitor Visa for Medical Treatment Purpose

REQUIREMENTS

- Application form
Go to website: <https://visawebapp.boca.gov.tw>. Fill out the application form online and print it out. Make sure the application form shows a bar code on it. Sign the application form.
- Two colored passport- size photos
Place two (2) glossy, 2"x1.5", white background photos that were taken within the last six (6) months on the application form.
- Passport
The passport must be valid for at least 6 months with blank pages. One photocopy of the passport bio page with the applicant's photo is required.
- Diagnosis statement from the hospitals or medical institutions in the Philippines
- Diagnosis and treatment recommendation letter from Taiwanese hospitals and medical institution indicating patient's (or family company's) name and the tentative staying period
- Evidence of funds
Bank statement (above USD\$30,000) or payment plan approved by Taiwan medical institutions
- PSA Birth Certificate (only those with Philippine passports)
- PSA Marriage Certificate (if a female applicant is married; only those with Philippine passports)
- Other supporting documents
 - (1) For the applicant who is the company of the patient, the kinship document is required.
 - (2) The applicant will be scheduled for an interview if required. Other additional documents may be required during processing.

NOTICES

1. All documents submitted to this office must be original with one (1) set of photocopies on A4-sized paper. Original documents are to be returned after review.
2. Visas are issued as stipulated by Article 12 of the Statute governing the issuance of ROC visas for foreign passports. As a sovereign nation, the ROC has the right to refuse visa applications without providing any explanation for such decisions; the visa application fee is not refundable.
3. Visa application for urgent medical treatment can be initiated by Taiwan Medical institutions to the Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
4. Family dependents, spouse or relatives within the third degree of relationship, and not more than two people, may accompany the applicant. If necessary, additional accompanying medical personnel from the country of residency (a maximum of one person) is also permitted. The accompanying individuals must submit a relationship certificate or a certificate as a medical professional.
